
Daryl Baldwin: Ken Hale Memorial Lecture (2013)

This month, we would like to revisit and share a great lecture given by Daryl Baldwin at the *Revisiting the State of Indigenous Languages National Conference* in 2013.

Daryl Baldwin is a member of the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma, the Director of the Myaamia Center at Miami University in Oxford, and a leader in the movement(s) to reclaim Indigenous languages.

The goal of the conference was to critically examine the state of Indigenous languages since the passage of the Native American Languages Act (NALA 1990 and 1992).




